COMBINED CAMPBELL DONATION OF \$500,000 BRINGS THE SALVATION ARMY KROC CENTER CLOSER TO ITS GOAL

(AIEA, Hawaii, June 6, 2007) -- The James Campbell Company and the James & Abigail Campbell Family Foundation have donated a combined \$500,000 to The Salvation Army Ray and Joan Kroc Corps Community Center in Kapolei. The donation will be used to help complete construction of the multi-million dollar community center, which will open to the public in early 2010 and provide programs and activities for all ages. Steve MacMillan, CEO of the James Campbell Company, and Wendy Crabb, Director of the James & Abigail Campbell Family Foundation, presented a \$500,000 check to Major Phil Lum, Director of The Salvation Army Kroc Center, at a ceremony held this afternoon at The Salvation Army Leeward Corps Facility in Aiea. The grant is among the largest donations made to the Hawaii Kroc Center development effort.

“The Kroc Center will be the state’s largest community center and a wonderful resource for all Hawaii residents, particularly those who live on the Leeward Coast,” said Major Dave Hudson, Divisional Commander of The Salvation Army Hawaiian and the Pacific Islands Division. “We are extremely grateful to the James Campbell Company and the James & Abigail Campbell Foundation and their generous donation, which brings us one step closer to the center’s completion.”

“We consider this an investment in the future of the community. The Kroc Center will nurture people of all ages by providing much-needed services at the heart of the fastest growing region in the state,” said Steve MacMillan, CEO of the James Campbell Company.

"Our contribution gives us an amazing opportunity to make a substantial impact on the lives of adults, children and families," said Wendy Crabb, Director of the James & Abigail Campbell Family Foundation. "It all starts at the community level, which is why we are so excited to support The Salvation Army in creating a resource for those who live in Kapolei and throughout Oahu.”

Located on 12 acres of land on the corner of the new North-South Road and East-West Road in Kapolei, the Kroc Center will be available to children, adults, seniors, and families. The facility will include:

- Worship Center and Performing Arts Theater
- Gymnasium
- Competition pool
- Leisure pool (active family swim area)
- Fitness Center
- Commercial kitchen
- Banquet facility (meeting and event space)
- Multi-functional community rooms
- Education Center
- Outdoor Cultural Activities Center
- Pre-School
- Audio and Visual Learning Center
- Green space for outdoor activities

Mrs. Joan Kroc, wife of the founder of McDonald's and a supporter of The Salvation Army, funded the development of a Salvation Army Community Center in San Diego. When she passed away in October 2003, Mrs. Kroc left \$1.6 billion to The Salvation Army to build more Kroc Community Centers around the country. Honolulu was one of 19 Western cities competing for this funding. On May 1, 2006, the city was awarded \$80 million for the center, 50% being used for construction of the facilities, and 50% for an endowment to partially fund the operation of the center.

As part of her will, Mrs. Kroc believed that the success of the Kroc Center relies on the community's support and ownership. In addition to her gift, she required that The Salvation Army raise additional funds in public support to complete and sustain the Kroc Center. The Salvation Army is raising \$23 million to match the Kroc gift.

The James Campbell Company succeeded the Estate of James Campbell, a 107-year-old private trust that was the legacy of one of Hawaii's foremost business pioneers. Its affiliate, Kapolei Property Development, focuses on the development of the City of Kapolei. Kapolei has become the state's fastest growing region and has emerged as a booming economic center, providing more than 25,000 jobs in over 800 businesses. The James & Abigail Campbell Family Foundation is a private foundation funded by the descendants of James Campbell and other individuals. Over the last decade, the James Campbell Company and the James & Abigail Campbell Foundation have collectively given more than \$13 million in charitable donations. The majority has been used to support programs for the Leeward area.
